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ANNUAL REPORT FOR THE YEAR 2016 **PRESIDENT'S REVIEW AND ANALYSIS**

The Foundation experienced a number of changes during 2016. Besides the normal election of new board members and officers at the July annual meeting, new processes and procedures were implemented to increase the efficiency of the Foundation and to prepare for a grant writing effort aimed at generating funds for the maritime pavilion.

We've streamlined our banking by taking steps to consolidate our checking and savings accounts to one entity – 1st Advantage Federal Credit Union. The ATMF has for a number of years had a checking account with Bank of America and a savings account with 1st Advantage. After reviewing costs and accessibility, it was decided to go with 1st Advantage. That process should be completed by the time this annual report is completed and sent to the membership.

The Foundation also took steps to move all of our stock holdings into one account with Wells Fargo Advisors. Stock certificates held at the Foundation office were transferred to Wells Fargo so that we could maximize our investment portfolio returns. This has worked well to this point and we envision it being financially advantageous to us in the foreseeable future.

Our Gift Shop management also saw significant changes in 2016. Late in the fall of 2015 Ms. Patricia "Trish" Wright left the Foundation for personal reasons and management of the shop was taken

over by Ms. Jennifer Linzmeier who had worked as the weekend sales associate for over two years. Ms. Linzmeier has made significant changes to inventory items and worked closely with the ATMF staff to begin preparation for an automated Point of Sale (POS) system which would provide urgently needed inventory management processes. That system, provided by Lightspeed, was contracted for in the fall of 2016 and was put in place in early 2017.

2016 also saw the start of a partnering relationship with Old Dominion University in Norfolk. There is an article appearing later in this report/newsletter that describes the initiative in detail. The bottom line is the ATMF should be able to bring on college level interns to assist us in grant writing, marketing of the museum and badly needed help in Information Technology.

One final change made in 2016 was to increase the number of raffle tickets included in the Spring Newsletter (mailed to the membership) from ten to twenty. This small change resulted in a doubling of donations received for the 2016 annual raffle.

All-in-all 2016 was a good year. Thanks go to all of the members of the Board of Directors and Advisors and to our membership for their loyal support!

ATMF would like to apologize to all the Transporters for the delay of over a month in the publication of the 2017-2018 Retired REDBOOK. The high volume of Questionnaires that were returned to the ATMF in January and February caused the delay.

The Retired REDBOOK is a directory of retired Transportation Corps Officers, members of the Senior Executive Service, Warrant Officers and Non-Commissioned Officers (MSG and above). The directory includes their name, rank, address, phone number and/or email address—if the retiree wants that information published. It is as

current and accurate as we can make it based on the information provided by the retiree or his or her family members. Once we are made aware of a retiree's death, we remove that name from the REDBOOK, but maintain his or her name in our database.

MUSEUM DIRECTOR'S REPORT



The LARC V has left the Yard! Using year-end CMH funding, MG (R) Whaley's super contacts with a local trucking company and a borrowed 40-ton crane from the Transportation

School, the LARC V is now being refurbished. Hopefully there will also be time to get the LARC XV done prior to the funding expiring. A separate article follows.

The Caribou has also been cleaned, thanks to CW4(R) Becky Brashears and

Neff Corporation's Doris Hilbmann. We are funded for a concrete pad for the Caribou which will be situated parallel to the Aviation Pavilion along Jefferson Avenue. Once the pad is complete I hope to have the Caribou moved and refurbished.

7 April 2017 was a great day for the Museum with our event "Declaration of War!!" We hosted a special WWI event from 0900-1600 that Friday. Rich Killblane and Steve McGeorge had displays focused on the items the America Soldier took to war. We also had a lunchtime speaker, Leo Hirrel, author of "Supporting the Doughboys." Four new permanent WWI exhibit cases were unfurled.

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MUSEUM DIRECTOR'S REPORT

The Army & the Circus! exhibit is now open. Colorful and informative (but lacking actual artifacts), we hope this temporary exhibit engages the soldiers and visitors!

I continue to work with the Corps of Engineers in securing an estimate for the design of the future Watercraft Pavilion. Once we have the design I hope to be able to generate some excitement (and funding!).

We are currently working on a 3-D image program with the CASCOM IT folks in order to install an iPad that allows visitors to view (and manipulate) artifacts that are not currently on exhibit.

I recently submitted the Museum's contribution for the larger TRADOC Manager's Internal Control Program (MICP). That report has generated authorization for the museum to be closed on Sundays

beginning in June of this year. While we are not pleased at the prospect, we have failed artifact accountability issues and are often forced to run the museum with two civil servants, both situations are highly troubling. There is a future possibility that we could secure an additional personnel authorization, if that occurs we would be able to once again open six days a week to the public.

I will be TDY for several months this summer, the current plan is June – September. I will be working at the Center for Military History at Fort Belvoir in a professional development assignment. I leave you in the solid and capable hands of Marc Sammis, Head Curator.

A TEAM EFFORT TO TRANSPORT AND REFURBISH THE LARC V

In 1968, the Army Transportation Museum (ATM) took ownership of prototype number five of seven LARC V's (Lighter, Amphibious, Resupply, Cargo vehicle, capable of hauling 5-tons). Crafted in 1960 in Kalamazoo, Michigan (by Borg Warner), this macro-artifact was originally intended to replace the DUKW. Used at Cape Canaveral to support NASA, and also in amphibious training exercises, the LARC V was the last prototype used before being given to the museum.

On 27 Jan 2017, at the quarterly Army Transportation Museum Foundation

(ATMF) Board of Directors Meeting, Strategic Planning Chair Person, CW4(R) Becky Brashears, and Museum Director Ms. Claire Samuelson, urged the Board to invest funds in order to transport the amphibious vehicle to the Fort Eustis Logistics Readiness Center (LRC) for restoration. The Board agreed and voted on a dollar figure to invest in the transport. Advisory Board Member, MG(R) Dave Whaley, committed to contacting a colleague of his who had the means to transport the LARC V via a lowbed truck.

MG(R) Whaley contacted Consolidated Logistics Center which is owned and operated by a former Army Transportation officer, Mr. Larry Battle. MG(R) Whaley explained to him that the Foundation was looking for transportation for the LARC V for restoration. Mr. Battle not only agreed to move it but offered to do so free of charge, as a service to the ATM and Foundation!!

By 2 Feb 2017, Ms. Samuelson made all necessary contacts and plans with Mr. Battle and the Army Transportation School's Maritime and Intermodal Training Department (MITD) for the LARC V to be transported for restoration. A crane, provided by the T-School, and the truck arrived, witnessed by ATMF BoD members, MSG(R) Marina Libro and Ms. Nicki Bowersox, Museum Chief Curator Mr. Marc Sammis, along with Ms. Samuelson.

Lifting the LARC V, swinging it over the perimeter fence and finally lowering the LARC V to the lowbed trailer were executed flawlessly. The LARC V is currently being



restored at the Ft. Eustis LRC with funding support from the Center for Military History (CMH)

and will be returned when finished.

We would like to thank Mr. Larry Battle and Consolidated Logistics Center for their gracious efforts to transport the LARC V and for their service donation. In addition we want to thank members of the MITD for supplying the crane. Also, a special thanks to MG(R) Whaley for reaching out to Mr. Battle. And finally a thank you to the CMH for providing ~\$59K in funding.

ATMF ESTABLISHES INTERNSHIP PROGRAM WITH OLD DOMINION UNIVERSITY

In April of 2016 ATMF began what is hoped to be a long term mutually beneficial working relationship with Old Dominion University (ODU). During this time, ATMF representatives (COL's retired Race and Conroy, USN Retired Chief Robbins and BOA member Ms. Nicki Bowersox) met with ODU Director of Military Activity Liaison and Special Projects, CAPT, USN, Ret, Robert Clark to begin building the relationship.

CAPT Clark put us in touch with ODU'S Assistant Director of Career Services, Melody Iannone, to develop and outline an internship program. ATMF representatives attended an ODU Internship Fair in February 2017. At the Fair, MSG(R) Marina Libro and Ms. Bowersox handed out information brochures to prospective interns and accepted resumes and applications from students interested in an internship with the ATMF.

On 30 Jan 2017, the ATMF hosted a luncheon in the museum's Regimental Room and museum tour with faculty members of ODU. University attendees included Dr. Jeff Tanner, Dean of the Strome College of Business; Mrs. Beverly Forbes, Director of the Career Services Department, and Alice Jones, Assistant Director of Career Services for the College of Arts and Letters. The tour of the museum was given by museum director Ms. Claire Samuelson and the history of the ATMF was included by the Foundation president.

Ideas proposed by the ODU faculty for ATMF/ODU partnerships included: an



annual ODU day held at the museum for students, faculty and Alumni; designing a

class project around an ATMF strategic goal; a student competition to design marketing strategies; gaining aid from non-traditional students from sister school Thomas Nelson Community College; and involving volunteers to aid in the annual ATM Halloween event. Each invitee received materials about ATMF and museum, and an autographed book by TC historian and author Richard Killblane.

Since the luncheon and Internship Fair, ATMF Board Director BG(R) Levasseur and Ms. Bowersox outlined a timeline and needed actions for the internship selection process. Applicants who meet the University's requirements for internships will be interviewed by ATMF Directors and Advisors for a potential Summer/Fall Internship. They will also mentor each intern in the fields of their expertise.

We hope to welcome our first ODU interns for either the summer or fall semester. We are grateful and excited about the partnering with Old Dominion University and look forward to more events with the university in the future.

Sergeant Elmer A. Mumley,
374th Motor
Transport
Company/9th
Motor Command
(Groupe Robinson),
Reserve Mallet, 1918-1919

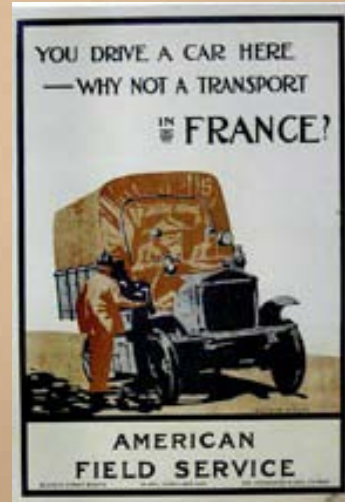


Sergeant Elmer A. Mumley was a member of the Reserve Mallet (pronounced Mal-LAY) that was composed of Americans who had joined the American Field Service – the American Mission to France – and then served with the French Motor Transport Corps. Initially they drove the ambulances in support of the Allies, and eventually were pressed to transport

ammunition as well. SGT Mumley participated in eight campaigns during his time in France and was promoted to sergeant in March 1919.

While many Americans left the French Army to enlist in the U.S. Army after the declaration of war against Germany, others continued to serve with the French. It was these soldiers that constituted the Reserve Mallet.

The unit was named after their French commander, Captain Mallet.



The 9th Motor Command (Groupe Robinson) (French spelling) was named after its commanding officer Captain Frank O. Robinson.

FOCUS ON AN ARTIFACT

Sergeant Elmer A. Mumley's coat, a donation to the Transportation Museum, has the insignia of the Reserve Mallet. It also has his sergeant's chevron sewn onto the right sleeve and War Service chevrons on the left sleeve.

His coat was supposed to be on exhibit in one of the three new WWI cases, but it was quickly evident there was not enough

room for it. It will be highlighted in the temporary case at the beginning of the galleries in the next year.
